Dear Sir,

Further to your request, Paterson Group (Paterson) carried out a Phase I - Environmental Site Assessment (Phase I ESA) Update for the aforementioned property. This report updates a previous Phase I ESA report completed by Paterson, dated November 13, 2013, and is intended to meet the requirements of a Phase I ESA Update, as per the MECP Standard O.Reg. 153/04, as amended, under the Environmental Protection Act. This report is to be read in conjunction with the previous report.

Site Information

The Phase I Property is vacant land with no structures present on-site. The Phase I Property is located on the south side of Famille-Laporte Avenue, at the southwest corner of the Famille-Laporte Avenue and Géographe Terrace intersection, in the City of Ottawa, Ontario. The Phase I property is an irregular shaped lot in a INZ/N3B – Institutional Zone. The property is surrounded by residential properties and a former nursery to the north. The Phase I Property is situated in a municipally serviced area. The configuration of the Phase I Property is shown on Drawing PE2392-11 - Site Plan, which is appended to this report.





Records Review

Phase I ESA Study Area Determination

A radius of approximately 250m was determined to be appropriate as a Phase I ESA Study Area for this assignment. Properties outside the 250m radius are not considered to have the potential to impact the Phase I Property, based on their separation distance.

First Developed Use Determination

Based on the historical review, the Phase I Property was vacant agricultural land prior to its use as part of Laporte Flowers and Nursery from the 1990s until 2014, although it has never been formally developed. The Phase I Property is currently vacant and unutilized.

Previous Engineering Reports

- ❑ 'Phase I Environmental Site Assessment, Proposed Cardinal Creek Village Subdivision Lands, Old Montreal Road, Ottawa (Cumberland), Ontario', prepared by Paterson Group, dated November 13, 2013.

The original Phase I ESA (PE2392-3) was completed for a much larger tract of land that included the current Phase I Property. Based on the findings of the Phase I ESA, no past or current environmental concerns were identified on the subject land. No off-site potentially contaminating activities (PCAs) were noted. A Phase II ESA was not recommended for the subject property at that time.

A geotechnical investigation was conducted on the Phase I Property by Paterson in 2026. No signs of environmental contamination or deleterious fill material were observed throughout the course of the subsurface investigations, although some reworked native soil from an earlier development phase of the subdivision has been placed on the subject property.

Environment Canada

A search of the National Pollutant Release Inventory (NPRI) was conducted electronically on May 20, 2026. The Phase I property and adjacent properties were not listed in the NPRI database. No records of pollutant release were listed in the database for properties located within the Phase I study area.

Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) Instruments

A request was submitted to the MECP Freedom of Information (FOI) office for information with respect to certificates of approval, permits to take water, certificates of property use or any other similar MECP issued instruments for the site. The response from the ministry



stated that no relevant records were located. A copy of the ministry response is included in the attachments.

MECP Submissions

A request was submitted to the MECP FOI office for information with respect to reports related to environmental conditions for the property. The response from the ministry stated that no relevant records were located. A copy of the ministry response is included in the attachments.

MECP Incident Reports

A request was submitted to the MECP FOI office for information with respect to records concerning environmental incidents, orders, offences, spills, discharges of contaminants or inspections maintained by the MECP for the site or adjacent properties. The response from the ministry stated that no relevant records were located. A copy of the ministry response is included in the attachments.

MECP Waste Management Records

A request was submitted to the MECP FOI office for information with respect to waste management records. The response from the ministry stated that no relevant records were located. A copy of the ministry response is included in the attachments.

MECP Coal Gasification Plant Inventory

The Ontario Ministry of Environment document titled "Municipal Coal Gasification Plant Site Inventory, 1991" was reviewed to reference the locations of former plants with respect to the site. No Municipal Coal Gasification Plant Sites are located within the Phase I study area.

MECP Brownfields Environmental Site Registry

A search of the MECP Brownfields Environmental Site Registry was conducted as part of this assessment for the site, neighbouring properties, and the general area of the site. No Records of Site Condition (RSCs) were filed for the Phase I property or adjacent properties.

Areas of Natural Significance

A search for areas of natural and scientific interest situated within the Phase I study area was conducted electronically via the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (OMNRF) website. The search did not identify any natural features or areas of natural significance within the Phase I study area.



Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA)

The TSSA, Fuels Safety Branch in Toronto, was contacted electronically to inquire about current and former underground storage tanks for the site and neighbouring properties. No records are listed in the TSSA registry for the Phase I property or neighbouring properties. The response from the TSSA is appended to this report.

City of Ottawa Landfill Document

The City of Ottawa's Former Landfills online map was reviewed as part of this assessment. This map identifies 123 former landfills through the City of Ottawa's Old Landfill Management Strategy (OLMS 2004) and includes location, ownership, periods of operation and waste type for 82 sites identified as previously owned/operated either fully or in part by former municipalities and townships within the boundaries of the City of Ottawa and is updated periodically.

A review of this map on May 20, 2026, did not identify any landfill sites situated on the Phase I Property or within 250m of the Phase I Property.

City of Ottawa Historical Land Use Inventory (HLUI) Database

As part of this assessment, a requisition form was submitted to the City of Ottawa to request information from the City's Historical Land Use Inventory (HLUI) database for any environmental records pertaining to the Phase I Property as well as any properties situated within the Phase I study area. A response from the City of Ottawa was received on July 3, 2026.

The response from the City of Ottawa indicated that the Environmental Remediation unit, the Sewer Use Program, and Solid Waste Services had no records relating to the Phase I Property. In addition, the Ottawa Public Health Department website returned no relevant results for the Phase I Property. The HLUI search returned 1 area feature within the Phase I Study Area.

The area record returned pertained to the former Laporte Nursery located on the Phase I Property and north of the Phase I Property. This former activity is not considered to result in an APEC on the Phase I Property.

A copy of the HLUI response letter and summary report has been included in the attachments.

ERIS Database Report

A database report, prepared by ERIS (Environmental Risk Information Services) Ltd., dated May 6, 2026, was acquired and reviewed as part of this assessment. The complete ERIS reports have been included in the attachments.



☐ *On-Site Records:*

The ERIS report did not identify any records on the Phase I Property.

☐ *Off-Site Records:*

Eight (8) records were identified within the Phase I study area, including five water well records, one pesticide record, one spill record and one pipeline incident record. A pesticide record was identified for Laporte Flowers and Nursery to the north of the Phase I Property. (A soil testing program was completed under separate cover to address the pesticide record.)

The remaining records are not considered to pose a potential environmental concern to the Phase I Property due to their nature.

Aerial Photographs

The latest aerial image in the 2013 Phase I ESA report was from 2011. A review of the aerial photograph from 2022 indicated that the Phase I Property is no longer a part of the Laporte Flowers and Nursery. The properties within the study area, which were previously undeveloped are now occupied by residential dwellings. No potential concerns were identified from reviewing the 2022 aerial image. A copy of the 2022 aerial image has been included in the attachments.

Topographic Maps

Topographic maps were obtained from Natural Resources Canada – The Atlas of Canada website and from the City of Ottawa website. Topographic maps were obtained from Natural Resources Canada – The Atlas of Canada website and from the City of Ottawa website. The topographic maps indicate the regional topography in the general area of the site slopes down towards the Ottawa River, approximately 780m north. An illustration of the referenced topographic map is presented on Figure 2 – Topographic Map, appended to this report.

Physiographic Maps

A Physiographic Map was reviewed from the Natural Resources Canada - The Atlas of Canada website. According to this physiographic map, the site is located in the St. Lawrence Lowlands. According to the mapping description provided: “The lowlands are plain-like areas that were all affected by the Pleistocene glaciations and are therefore covered by surficial deposits and other features associated with the ice sheets.” The Phase I property is located in the Central St. Lawrence Lowland, “where the land is rarely more than 150m above sea level, except for the Monteregian Hills, which consist of intrusive igneous rocks”.



Geological Maps

The Geological Survey of Canada website on the Urban Geology of the National Capital Area was consulted as part of this assessment. Based on this information, bedrock in the area of the site consists of interbedded limestone and dolomite of the Gull River Formation. Overburden soils are reported as offshore marine sediments with drift thickness on the order of 15 to 50m.

Water Well Records

A search of the MECP website returned 6 well records identified in the Phase I study area, including water supply wells and monitoring wells. The records pertain to domestic drinking wells and livestock wells drilled between 1974 and 2002 for nearby residential dwellings / farmsteads. According to the well records, the stratigraphy in the Phase I study area generally consisted of clay overlying limestone and shale bedrock. No concerns were identified during the well record review.

Property Owner Representative Interview

Mr. Mike Green, of Tamarack Homes, was interviewed as part of this update. Mr. Green was unaware of any potential environmental concerns on the subject and neighbouring properties.

Site Reconnaissance

A site visit was conducted on May 15, 2026. Weather conditions were overcast, with temperatures of approximately 15°C. Mr. Mohammed Ramadan from the Environmental Department of Paterson Group conducted the site inspection. In addition to the site, the uses of neighbouring properties within the Phase I Study Area were also assessed at the time of the site visit.

The site is vacant and covered with low vegetation. No buildings or temporary structures are on-site.

The regional and site topographies slope down to the north towards the Ottawa River. Site drainage is primarily infiltration. No discoloured vegetation was observed on the property.

No unidentified substances, private sewage systems or domestic wells were observed on the Phase I Property. No evidence of current or former railway or spur lines was observed on the subject property at the time of the site inspection. The surrounding properties were also observed during the site visit and are shown on Drawing PE2392-12 - Surrounding Land Use Plan.



Neighbouring Land Use

Neighbouring land use in the Phase I Study Area is residential. The Laporte Nursery to the north is no longer in operation. No existing PCAs were identified within the Phase I Study Area. Current land use within the Phase I Study Area is illustrated on Drawing: PE2392-12 – Surrounding Land Use Plan in the Figures section of this report, following the text.

Review and Evaluation of Information

Land Use History

Based on the historical review, the Phase I Property was vacant agricultural land prior to its use as part of Laporte Flowers and Nursery from the 1990s until 2014, although it was never formally developed. The Phase I Property is currently vacant.

Potentially Contaminating Activities and Areas of Potential Environmental Concern

No potentially contaminating activities (PCAs) were identified on the Phase I Property. Former pesticide use was identified on the Laporte Nursery lands to the north however this activity is not considered to result in an area of potential environmental concern (APEC).

Contaminants of Potential Concern

No Contaminants of Potential Concern (CPCs) were identified on the Phase I Property.

Conceptual Site Model

Geological and Hydrogeological Setting

The Geological Survey of Canada website on the Urban Geology of the National Capital Area was consulted as part of this assessment. Based on this information, bedrock in the area of the site consists of interbedded limestone and dolomite of the Gull River Formation. Overburden soils are reported as offshore marine sediments with drift thickness on the order of 15 to 50 m.

Groundwater is anticipated to flow in a northerly direction towards the Ottawa River.

Existing Buildings and Structures

No existing buildings or structures are present on the Phase I Property.



Water Bodies

The nearest named body of water is Cardinal Creek, located approximately 500m to the west.

Areas of Natural Significance

No areas of natural significance were identified on the Phase I Property or within the Phase I Study Area.

Drinking Water Wells

There are no domestic wells on-site. It is expected that the site will be municipally serviced, once developed.

Neighbouring Land Use

Neighbouring land use in the Phase I study area consists of residential properties. Land use is shown on Drawing Number PE2392-12- Surrounding Land Use Plan

Potentially Contaminating Activities and Areas of Potential Environmental Concern

As per Section 7.1 of this report, no PCAs that were considered to represent an APEC were identified on the Phase I property or in the Phase I study area.

Assessment of Uncertainty and/or Absence of Information

The absence of APECs within the Phase I study area was confirmed by a variety of independent sources. As such, the conclusions of this report are not affected by uncertainty which may be present with respect to the individual sources.

Conclusions

Based on the results of this Phase I ESA Update, **it is our opinion, that a Phase II Environmental Site Assessment is not required for the property.**

Statement of Limitations

This Phase I - Environmental Site Assessment Update report has been prepared under the supervision of a Qualified Person in general accordance with the agreed scope-of-work and O.Reg. 153/04. The conclusions presented herein are based on information gathered from a historical review and field inspection program.

The findings of the Phase I ESA Update are based on a review of readily available geological, historical and regulatory information and a cursory review made at the time of the field assessment. The historical research relies on information supplied by others,



such as local, provincial, and federal agencies and was limited within the scope-of-work, time, and budget of the project herein.

Should any conditions be encountered at the Phase I Property and/or historical information that differ from our findings, we request that we be notified immediately in order to allow for a reassessment.

This report was prepared for the sole use of Tamarack Homes. Permission and notification from Tamarack Homes and this firm will be required to release this report to any other party.

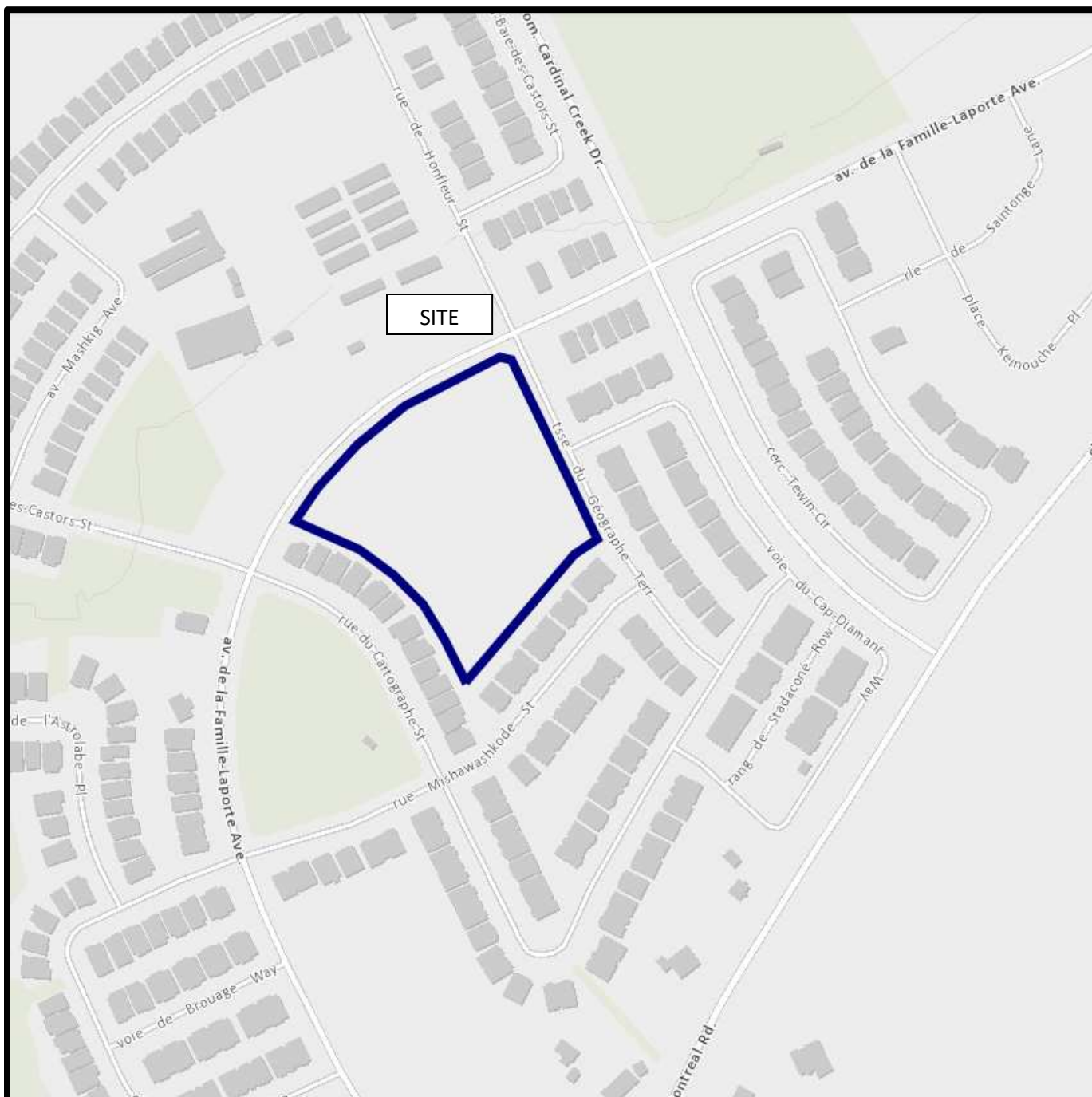

KEY PLAN

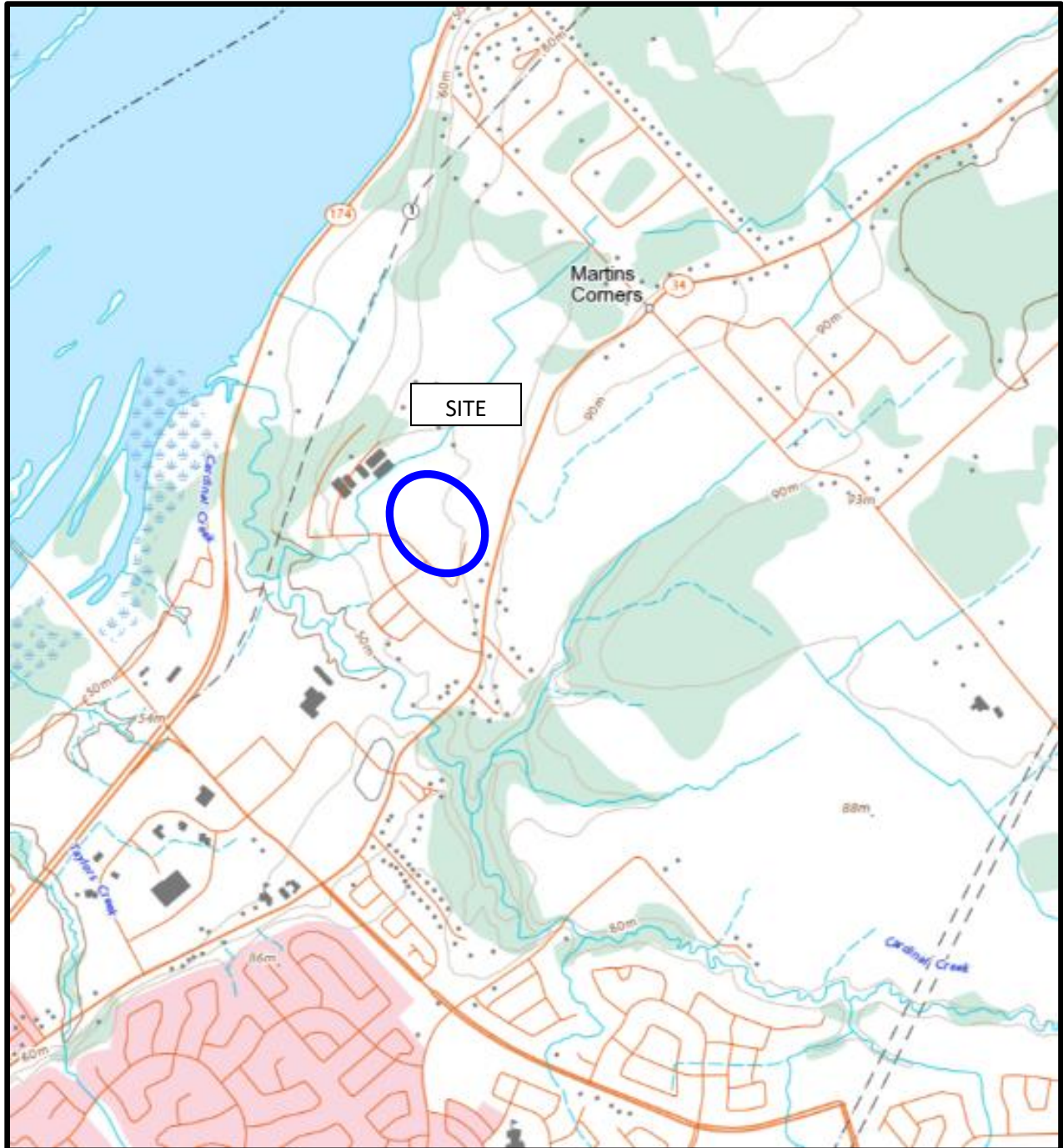
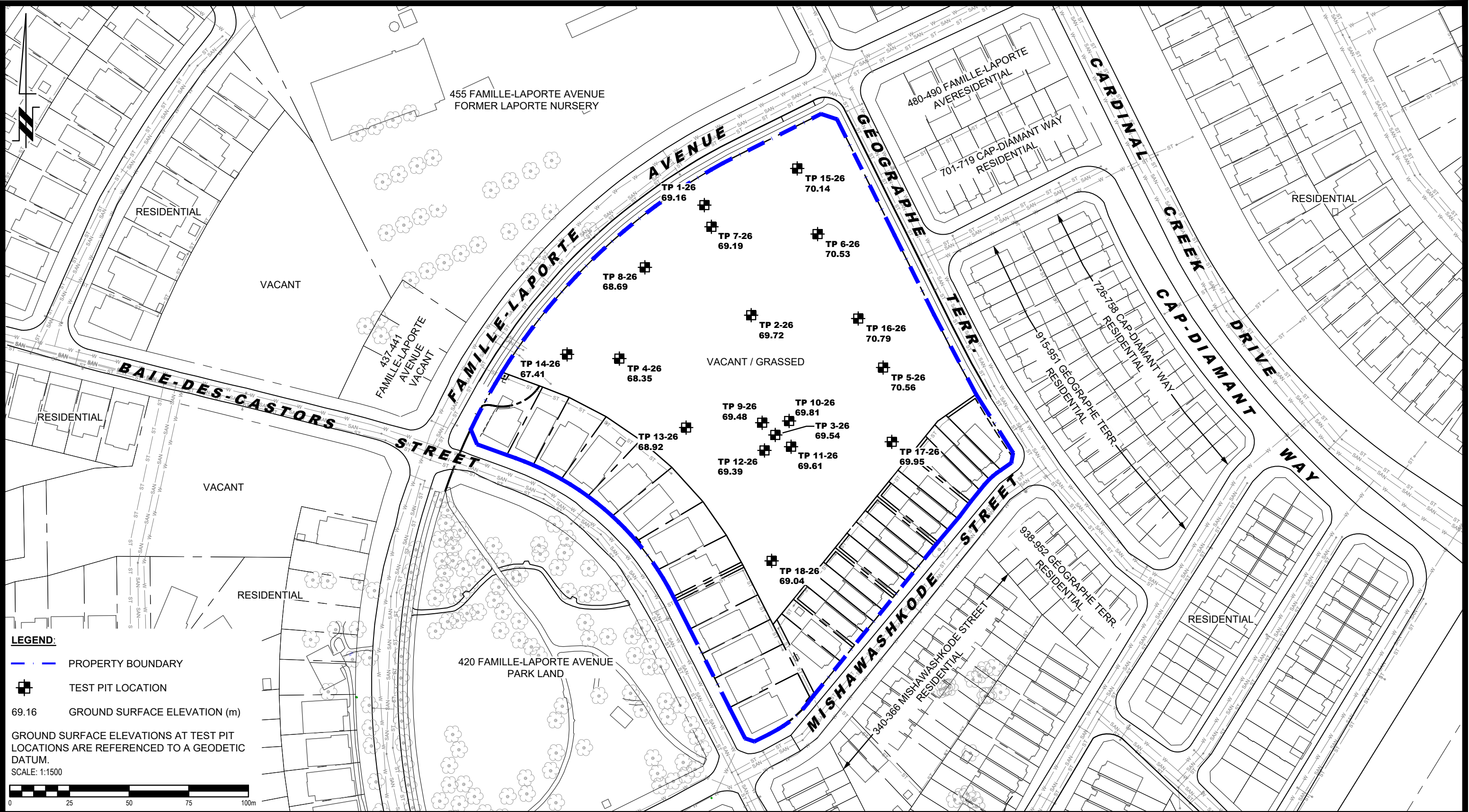

Definitions

Database Descriptions: This section provides a detailed explanation for each database including: source, information available, time coverage, and acronyms used. They are listed in alphabetic order.

Detail Report: This is the section of the report which provides the most detail for each individual record. Records are summarized by location, starting with the project property followed by records in closest proximity.

Distance: The distance value is the distance between plotted points, not necessarily the distance between the sites' boundaries. All values are an approximation.

Direction: The direction value is the compass direction of the site in respect to the project property and/or center point of the report.

Elevation: The elevation value is taken from the location at which the records for the site address have been plotted. All values are an approximation. Source: Google Elevation API.

Executive Summary: This portion of the report is divided into 3 sections:

'Report Summary'- Displays a chart indicating how many records fall on the project property and, within the report search radii.

'Site Report Summary'-Project Property'- This section lists all the records which fall on the project property. For more details, see the 'Detail Report' section.

'Site Report Summary-Surrounding Properties'- This section summarizes all records on adjacent properties, listing them in order of proximity from the project property. For more details, see the 'Detail Report' section.

Map Key: The map key number is assigned according to closest proximity from the project property. Map Key numbers always start at #1. The project property will always have a map key of '1' if records are available. If there is a number in brackets beside the main number, this will indicate the number of records on that specific property. If there is no number in brackets, there is only one record for that property.

The symbol and colour used indicates 'elevation': the red inverted triangle will dictate 'ERIS Sites with Lower Elevation', the yellow triangle will dictate 'ERIS Sites with Higher Elevation' and the orange square will dictate 'ERIS Sites with Same Elevation.'

Unplottables: These are records that could not be mapped due to various reasons, including limited geographic information. These records may or may not be in your study area, and are included as reference.
